







While WorldSkills competitions have been running in Ireland since the 1960s, a new chapter began in 2017 with the decision to showcase Skills, Apprenticeships, and Further and Higher Education opportunities more prominently. This led to the creation of the WorldSkills Ireland event at the RDS.

Now entering its fifth year, WorldSkills Ireland 2025 is set to be the biggest event yet, with over 35,000 students, teachers, guidance counsellors, and parents already registered to attend.

WorldSkills Ireland 2025 will take place at the RDS Simmonscourt Complex. Irish Times Higher Options will take place in the RDS Main Hall Complex. Athough we are running at the same time, a seperate booking is required to access both events. PLAN YOUR VISIT:



WorldSkills Ireland 2025 is more than just an event—it's a celebration of skills, apprenticeships, and careers! From hands-on demos to career zones and meet-and-greets with employers, you students will be spoilt for choice.

1) Review your Registration:

Please check your confirmation email to see your group's allocated day and timeslot. As most slots are now fully booked, it's vital that all reserved slots are used. If your school cannot attend, let us know promptly so we can reallocate your place to a school on the waiting list. To amend group size or cancel, email info@worldskillsireland.ie.

2) Plan ahead:

- Watch the short or long version highlight video
- Decide which Talk your students will attend at the Heroes Stage. Talks are 30 minutes long, seating is limited.
- Review the list of companies and education providers to meet in the Careers' Zone, Educators' Zone, and #ThisIsFET Zone.
- Review the <u>floorplan</u> to get familiar with the venue layout.

3) National Competition Finals:

Please ensure your students understand that WorldSkills Ireland is a National Competition Event. Live competition finals will be taking place across the three days, with over 180 of Ireland's top apprentices battling to be crowned the best in their skill. We encourage students to watch the competitions and be inspired by the talent and dedication on display, but it is essential that they respect the competitors and avoid causing any distractions.

4) Try a Skill:

Speak to further education experts at the #ThisIsFET zone and celebrate the diversity of opportunity and value that skills-based jobs can bring. While you are there, try out a new skill - there will be a lot on show including make up artistry and prosthetics, animation and video production, cake decorating, advanced manufacturing and virtual welding, to name but a few.

5) MTU Pocket Guide Challenge - WIN BIG!

6) Teacher Focus:

The Institute of Guidance Counsellors (IGC) have returned as the Official WorldSkills Ireland 2025 Education Partner. The IGC will be located on Stand C23 beside the Café if you wish to talk to the team there.

This year, WorldSkills Ireland 2025 will feature a dedicated Teacher Zone. Designed as a quiet space, it allows teachers to relax, purchase tea, coffee, and refreshments, and avoid the long queues at the café.

7) Travel & Parking Info

With over 35,000 students expected, the RDS will be pedestrianised to ensure safe and easy movement between venues.

To accommodate the large number of student coaches, there will be no onsite visitor car parking. More information on page 6 & 7.

8) Coach Parking:

All coaches should make their way to the Simmonscourt Complex for student drop-off or parking. Parking is €30 per coach, payable at the gate. Each coach will be assigned a number—please ensure this number is shared with students for their return journey.

Upon arrival, an appointed teacher must check in at the WorldSkills Ireland registration area to collect wristbands. They should then return to the bus to distribute these to students. More information on page 6 & 7.

9) Food & Drink:

Food options include outdoor food trucks (Eddie Rockets, Camile Thai, Zambrero, Pizza, and Kiosk), an onsite café, and a dedicated upstairs lunchroom for students bringing packed lunches. COACH TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT PLAN

There is comprehensive traffic management plan in place for WorldSkills Ireland 2025 and The Irish Times Higher Options. This plan involves input from the RDS, Security Suppliers and the Gardai.

In order to accommodate the high number of student visitors attending on coaches to both events, we have no car parking available onsite. Therefore, the recommended mode of the travel to those not attending via Coach to the RDS each day is by Public Transport.

Coach Parking Route and Fee:



Coahces/Buses will be told to approach the RDS and Simmonscourt Road from the Anglesea Road.
Simmonscourt Road will be coned off by the Garda.

All coaches should make their way to
Simmonscourt Complex for student drop off or parking. Parking is **30 EUR per coach** payable at the gate.

Buses will be numbered upon arrival into Simmonscourt and parked according to length of stay (full or half day). Please ensure to share this number with students for return journeys.

All traffic into Simmonscourt will exit via Shrewsbury Gate (Gate Q).



Pedestrian Plan:



There will be two manned pedestrian routes through the RDS complex:

- i. BLUE Route going to HO
- ii. PINK Route going to WSI

These routes will be manned by Freeflow Traffic and Frontline security.

There will be one entry pointin to RDS main complex - Gate M

There will only be one exit point from RDS complex - Gate L

There will be one crossing point manned by the Garda at Wiley Gate into Simmonscourt Complex.

What to do when you arrive to the RDS:



Arriving via Bus:

Teachers are instructed to leave students on the bus, Head to the registration area alone, check-in and retrieve their students wristbands, distribute wristbands on the bus, and then the group enter together via the pink route.

Arriving via walking:

Groups will follow the pink route, the teacher will leave the students in the temporary holding area, go inside to the registration area and check-in to retrieve their students wristbands, distribute wristbands, and then the group enter together.



HEROES STAGE

The Heroes Stage, hosted by Andrea Hayes, is one of the standout features of WorldSkills Ireland. Each day, it brings together Industry Heroes, rising stars, and exciting guest Hero speakers from a wide range of sectors to share their stories and experiences. Through engaging panel discussions, attendees will hear powerful journeys—from apprentices who worked their way up to become CEOs, to professionals who have carved unique and innovative career paths. The Heroes Stage is designed to inspire students, teachers, and parents alike, showing how passion, perseverance, and skills can shape exciting and fulfilling futures.

WORLDSKILLS CAREER PERSONALITY QUIZ
